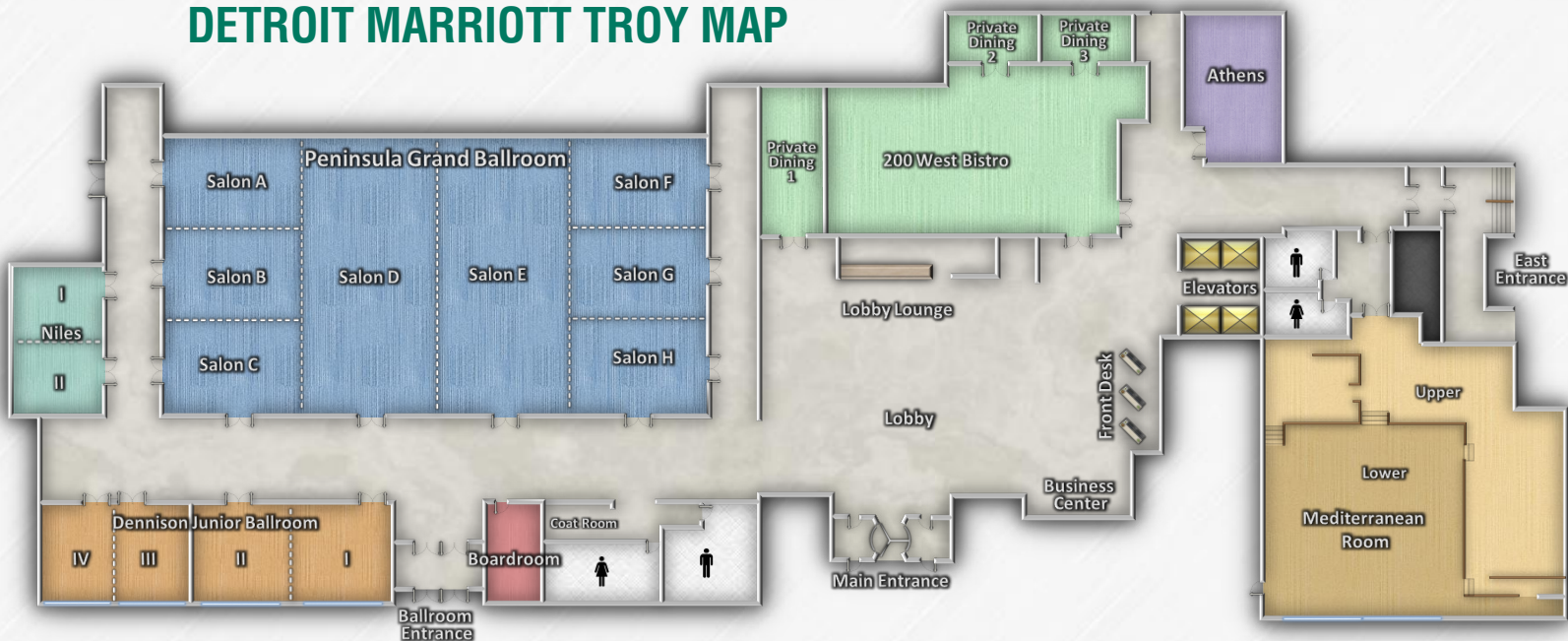

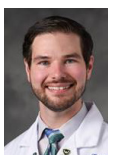

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES



Rob Campbell is the Director of Data Science and AI for Corewell Health. With a bachelor's degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering from the University of Michigan, Rob began his career designing submarines for the US Navy. Recognizing his love for solving problems with data, Rob pursued his passion and received his Master's degree in Analytics from Georgia

Tech, joining Corewell Health in early 2020. Between his experience working for a defense contractor for close to a decade and the past several years in healthcare, Rob has significant experience navigating highly regulated industries and solving complex problems using data. He has firsthand experience building machine learning models and exploring creative ways to apply artificial intelligence in both a personal and professional capacity. He leads the Artificial Intelligence Center of Excellence at Corewell Health, a centralized unit tasked with guiding effective and responsible adoption of AI throughout the organization. He is an ardent supporter and advocate for driving transformational change in healthcare by leveraging data science and AI.



William P. Dillon, DO is a staff physician on the transplant infectious disease team, medical director of the inpatient infectious disease unit, and clinical assistant professor at Wayne State University School of Medicine. He attended medical school at MSUCOM, completed residency and chief residency at Ascension St. John Moross and infectious disease and transplant

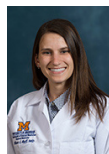
infectious disease fellowships at Henry Ford where he served as chief fellow and received the division award for fellow teacher of the year. His research interests include utility of surveillance bronchoscopies following transplant, OPAT in transplant recipients, and medical education.



Arati Kelekar, MD is Associate Professor, Department of Internal Medicine. She joined OUWB School of Medicine in 2013. Dr. Kelekar received her MD from Goa Medical College, Goa, India. She completed her residency in Internal Medicine from William Beaumont hospital (now Corewell Health East), Royal Oak, Michigan. She completed an additional year of chief residency at the same program. She has been practicing as an academic hospitalist at Beaumont Royal Oak since 2013 and is actively involved in teaching Internal Medicine and Medicine/Pediatric residents. She has been involved

in several Corewell Health hospital initiatives including patient centered communication, dementia simulation, vaccine hesitancy counseling and CPR standardization.

Dr. Kelekar is a co-course director of Art and Practice of Medicine (clinical skills course for M1 M2 students) since 2016. She is also the director for the year 3 Gateway assessment. Dr. Kelekar's areas of research interests include vaccine hesitancy counseling, clinical reasoning and point of care ultrasound.



Allison Ruff, MD, MHPE, FACP is Clinical Associate Professor, Primary Care Internist and educator at the University of Michigan. She serves as a member of the National Council of Early Career Physicians for the American College Physicians. Dr. Ruff has been involved in advocacy through ACP since residency and continues to draft resolutions and attend Leadership Day annually.



John F. Tu, MD is Associate Chief Medical Informatics Officer at Corewell Health and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Internal Medicine at Oakland University and William Beaumont School of Medicine. After graduating from University of Illinois, College of Medicine at Chicago, he completed his internal medicine residency at Loyola Health System, followed by an informatics fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital. Since 1996, he has worked in electronic health records implementation and optimization, specializing in clinical decision support and analytics.
