Anthony G. DiBartolomeo, MD, earned his medical degree from the WVU School of Medicine in 1967, completed residency training at the University of Minnesota, and completed a fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh. A United States Army veteran, Dr. DiBartolomeo served as a rheumatologist for the Walter Reed General Hospital in Washington, DC, then moving on to serve WVU as Professor of Medicine and Chief of the Section of Rheumatology. Dr. DiBartolomeo faithfully served the WVU School of Medicine in many roles, and was awarded outstanding teacher and outstanding faculty awards throughout his time with the institution.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Describe indications for treating menopausal symptoms with hormone therapy and explain risks and benefits hormone therapy
- Recognize the available consultative services and new advanced therapies available for acute and chronic diseases that affect patients in WV and surrounding areas.
